Executive V. Senate

In the matter of the Executive v. Senate in which Article II Section II Part III applies, we the Judicial review board find that the members of the EAC are not principle officers as defined by the constitution. Regarding this matter a principle officer as defined by the constitution is the chair of the EAC. As the Chair is the Secretary of Finance, a position that is specifically enumerated in the constitution, we do not feel further advice and consent is necessary for an already confirmed position. As non-binding legislation does not dictate what the definition of a principal office is, it shall be noted that the Senate does have the power to pass binding legislation aimed at amending the constitution, and thus changing the definition of principal officer.
