A Bill

to Amend the Constitution of the Student Assembly of the College of William & Mary in Virginia to Eliminate Extraneous Documents.

The Extraneous Document Elimination Act (EDE Act).

A bill of the Student Assembly Senate of the College of William and Mary in Virginia. Introduced for the Senate's consideration by Senator Victor Sulkowski ('07).

WHEREAS, the GEAR Act, recently and unanimously passed by this body, greatly reduced the number of documents and simplified the process of student government;

WHEREAS, the GEAR Act, in its original form, included a clause to eliminate the Titles of Regulation due to their lack of purpose, place, and use;

WHEREAS, said clause was omitted from the final bill because it was revealed to require a Constitutional Amendment;

WHEREAS, it befits this assembly to finish the work begun in the GEAR Act and finally attain a simple set of governing documents;

WHEREAS, the Titles of Regulation have rarely if ever been used, and then only for purposes so removed from the real acts of governing as to render them useless; and

WHEREAS, the power to permanently modify any of the governing documents on the Student Assembly is broadly agreed to rest within the domain of the legislative branch:

Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Senate of the Student Assembly of the College of William and Mary in Virginia –

- (1) strikes Article II, Section II, Part V of the Constitution of the Student Assembly.
